Christ's Resurrection Really Happened!

Why does belief in a true resurrection matter?

- It proves the Jesus was who he said he was.
- It's a foundation of our salvation (Rom. 10:9) and the hope that we will be raised, too.
- It turns our faith from a collection of truths into a vibrant, transformative relationship with God and others.

Can We Strengthen Our Faith with Evidence?

"Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else believe on account of the works themselves." (John 14:11)

- Our ideal is faith in the unseen, but God understands our need for evidence.
- No amount of evidence can provide absolute certainty.
- Our faith in the resurrection should be based on many things.

General Evidence for the Resurrection

- An empty tomb.
- Eyewitness accounts (the first by women).
- Transformed and committed disciples.
- The growth of Christianity
- A resurrection emphasis in early teaching.

That he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve."





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The Annals of Tacitus (116 AD)

Truth or Legend?

"Nero fastened the guilt and inflicted the most exquisite tortures on a class hated for their abominations, called Christians..."

Truth or Legend?

"Christus [Christ], from whom the name had its origin, suffered the extreme penalty during the reign of Tiberius at the hands of one of our procurators, Pontius Pilatus, and a most mischievous superstition, thus checked for the moment, again broke out not only in Judaea, the first source of the evil, but even in Rome, where all things hideous and shameful from every part of the world find their center and become popular."

Truth or Legend?

"Mockery of every sort was added to their deaths.

Covered with the skins of beasts, they were torn by dogs and perished, or were nailed to crosses, or were doomed to the flames and burnt, to serve as a nightly illumination, when daylight had expired."

Truth or Legend?

"Hence, even for criminals who deserved extreme and exemplary punishment, there arose a feeling of compassion. For it was not, as it seemed, for the public good, but to glut one man's cruelty, that they were being destroyed."
