



• TRUTH

"Jesus said, 'If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8:31-32)

• **BLESSING**

"Blessed...are those who hear the Word of God and obey it." (Luke 11:28)

"Wisdom preserves the life of its possessor." (Ecclesiastes 7:12)

• **GUIDANCE**

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path." (Psalm 119:105)

• **GROWTH**

Necessary Beliefs in God's Word

- **1.** The Bible is INFALLIBLE in its totality.
 - a. It is unfailing in its purpose.

"The law of the LORD is perfect, reviving the soul. The statutes of the LORD are trustworthy, making wise the simple." (Psalm 19:7)

- 2. The Bible is INERRANT in its parts.
 - a. It is free from error in all it affirms.

"Every word of God is flawless. He is a shield to those who take refuge in him." (Proverbs 30:5)

- **3. The Bible is AUTHORITATIVE.**
 - a. It has the right to prescribe all our beliefs and actions.

"Your Word, O LORD, is eternal. It stands firm in the heavens." (Psalm 119:89)

- 4. The Bible is SUFFICIENT.
 - a. It contains all needed information for living.

"His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness." (2 Peter 1:3)

- 5. The Bible is LIFE-GIVING.
 - a. It provides access to and assurance of salvation.

- 6. The Bible is TRUSTWORTHY.
 - a. It accomplishes what it promises.
