

IMPORTANT POINT!

While the questions we ask must begin with us... We must ask God to help reveal the answers!

A Few Preliminary Thoughts

- These are great questions to learn if you work with those who need change.
- But start with yourself! Try to answer these questions as best you can with absolute honesty.
- The answers likely won't come right away.
- These aren't the only questions to ask.
- This is just a <u>brief</u> introduction to these questions.

Question #1:

WHO AM I?



Question #1: Who am I?

This is a question about your <u>self-awareness</u> and <u>identity</u>.

"They came to circumcise the child, and they would have called him by the name of his father, Zacharias. His mother answered and said, 'No. He shall be called, John.'" (Luke 1:59:-60)

Question #1: Who am I?

This is a question about your <u>self-awareness</u> and <u>identity</u>.

 A sense of your personal identity affects the way you think, speak, and live.

Question #1: Who am I?

Jesus knew who he was!

"[Jesus] said to them, 'You are from beneath. I am from above. You are of this world. I am not of this world.'" (John 8:23)


"I am the light of the world. He who follows me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life." (John 8:12)

This is a question about your motives and purpose.

This is a question about your *motives* and *purpose*.

- Why am I here on this planet?
- Why was I born at this time and place?
- What is the purpose of my life?
- How can I discover and develop my purpose?

Question #3: What Do I Want?

This is a question about your will and desires.

"The desire of the righteous ends only in good, but the hope of the wicked [ends] only in wrath." (Proverbs 11:23)

Question #3: What Do I Want?

This is a question about your will and desires.

- Some of your desires will be healthy and good.
- Some of your desires will be unhealthy and not good for you or others.

Question #3: What Do I Want?

This is a question about your will and desires.

- What do I really and truly want out of life?
- What do I want from day to day?
- What kind of life am I living and how much of that is a result of what I want?


Question #3: What Do I Want?

This is a question about your will and desires.

- The best indicator for what you want is what you *think*, *say*, *and do*.
- Take an honest inventory of what you think, say, and do, and see if you can determine where your desires lie most of the time.

Question #4:

- Aligning what you want with what God wants is more than just a question of learning or knowledge...
- It's also a question of submission.

Question #7: Who Am I Becoming?

This is a question about your belief & vision.

 Most of the time when it comes to change, we can't believe in God, or in ourselves, until God first believes in us.

"Jesus looked at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John. You will be called Cephas' [which, when translated, is 'Peter']."
(John 1:42)

Question #7: Who Am I Becoming?

This is a question about your belief & vision.

 You need to get around people who will look into your heart and will accept you for who you are while having a vision for who you can become.

"Jesus said to her, 'I don't condemn you. Now go and sin no more." (John 8:11)

Question #8: Who Am I With?

This is a question about your *relationships*.

"Moses said to God, 'Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, that I should bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?' So [God] said, 'I will certainly be with you.'" (Exodus 3:11-12)

Question #8: Who Am I With?

This is a question about your relationships.

- You may have answered the first seven questions to your satisfaction.
- But if you plant yourself around those who aren't asking the same questions and seeking change in the way you are, then nothing else will matter.
