

"So he got up and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion for him, and ran and embraced him and kissed him.


And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.'" (Luke 15:20-21)


God Wants to Love Us Back to Life


"How great a love the Father has bestowed on us, that we would be called children of God." (1 John 3:1)
