

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



What Is Transcendent Freedom?

- Transcendent freedom is defined not just by our freedom to choose, but also by the quality of life that results from our choices.
- Transcendent freedom is found when our choices move beyond our right to our own independence, to a life guided by the bonds of Godly relationship.

3 Things That Distinguish Freedom in Godly Relationship

Freedom in Godly Relationship...

1. Outweighs our right to self-government.

"The Lord God commanded the man, 'You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat of it you will surely die." (Genesis 2:16)

Freedom in Godly Relationship...

1. Outweighs our right to self-government.

"[The serpent] said to the woman, 'Did God really say, "You must not eat from any tree in the garden"?

You will not surely die...For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." (Genesis 3:1, 4-5)

Freedom in Godly Relationship... 1. Outweighs our right to self-government. **There is no true freedom without governance!** So, the question then is: **Under which governance** is my ultimate freedom to be found? **In myself or in my Creator?**

Freedom in Godly Relationship...

1. Outweighs our right to self-government.

"If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." (Romans 10:9)

Freedom in Godly Relationship...

2. Trades one Master for another.

When you were slaves to sin, you were free from the control of righteousness. What benefit did you reap at that time from the things you are now ashamed of? Those things result in death! But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves to God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life. (Romans 6:20-22)

Freedom in Godly Relationship...

2. Trades one Master for another.

"The Holy Spirit enables us to act in ways that are contrary to the natural impulses of our sinful nature. We are *released*...to be loving, patient, kind, faithful, and good." – Susan Dunn

Freedom in Godly Relationship...

3. Compels us to give up our lives for the freedom of others.

"For Christ's love compels us...he died for all that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again." (2 Corinthians 5:14-15)
