The Challenge of Loving as Jesus Loves


The beginning of love:

The Example of John-the-Baptist

"They came to John and said to him, 'Rabbi, he who was with you across the Jordan, to whom you bore witness—look, he is baptizing, and all are going to him.'

John answered, 'A person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven." (John 3:26-30)

Discovering Our True Identity and Worth

- We rebel against the notion that our identity and worth could come from anyone but ourselves.
- But if life is relationship, if that is our deepest need, then our lives will only find meaning—i.e., who we are and how we should live—by embracing the identity and purpose of our Creator.

Discovering Our True Identity and Worth

 The meaning we find in belonging to God is most often made real within the "laboratory" of human relationships—in loving others as Jesus loves us.

Pursing His Love Together

"Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others."

(Philippians 2:1-4)

Pursing His Love Together

"Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." (Philippians 2:5-8)

Less Is More

I need less...

- Finding my identity and worth in loving others as God loves me.

- Prioritizing the interests and welfare of others.
- Rejoicing in the growth and success of others.
- Serving others in whatever capacity is needed, whether large or small.
- Regularly joining others in our mutual need for God.

Less Is More

I need more...

- Living in hope for the day I'll receive more than I could ever imagine.
- Rejoicing every time God becomes "more" in me and in those he has called me to love.
